EASTERN ZAMBIA

We pray for all members and their families in EASTERN ZAMBIA

We pray for the interim committee running Mothers' Union in the diocese of Eastern Zambia. We pray too for the new Mothers' Union diocesan chaplain, Fr Cornelius Chalve. He is both the parish priest of Katete and also chaplain of the joint Anglican-RC St Francis hospital in his parish. Our correspondent in Leicester diocese is Jeannie Brightwell who hears news from Georgina Banda, the former Mothers' Union diocesan president of Eastern Zambia. Georgina lives in Mfuwe parish, which is the gateway to South Luangwa National Park. This is one of the greatest parks in Africa, known for the density and variety of its game and for the beauty of its landscape.

Zambia is predominantly a Christian country, with Anglicans making up around 2% of the population. The diocese of Eastern Zambia is one of the five Anglican dioceses in Zambia within the church of the Province of Central Africa. It includes Chipata, the provincial capital near the Malawi border. On Eastern Zambia's Southern border is Mozambique. Many Mothers' Union branches in Eastern Zambia meet weekly, members' ages varying from around 35 to 86 years. At the moment, they are holding classes in "Domestic Skills".

MOMBASA

We pray for all members and their families in MOMBASA.

We pray for Rev. Martha Mwero, the Mothers' Union Diocesan President and Phoebe Maine, the Diocesan Links Co-ordinator, corresponding with Margaret Watts of the Leicester Diocese.

Mombasa is located on the Indian Ocean, known as the white and blue city. It is classed as a historical trading centre, a very important port for trade across the Indian Ocean.

Prior to becoming of such importance, the area was once the site of settlements engaged in farming, fishing, and local trading. Mombasa is situated on a coral line island in a bay of the Indian Ocean. The island is linked to the mainland municipal territory of 100 sq. miles by causeway, bridge and ferry. It serves as the market for the region's agricultural products (sisal, cotton, sugar, kapok, coconuts, fruits and vegetables) and exports many of these. Industries include ship building and repair, metal and cement works, sugar processing, fertilisers, plant and oil refinery. The old city is strongly middle eastern with narrow streets and high houses, with carved ornamental balconies.

There is a magnificent Cathedral situated in Mombasa, known as the Anglican Church of Kenya, there are also many other places of worship in the city, serving the diverse communities, many of which are Christian denominations.

GWADWALADA and EKITI WEST in NIGERIA.

We pray for all members and their families in GWADWALADA and EKITI WEST.

The church of the Province of Nigeria is an autonomous church in the Anglican Communion. It separated itself from the rest of the Anglican Communion and, at the present time, there is still no communication between central Mothers' Union and Nigeria. However, we are linked with the dioceses of Gwagwalada and Ekiti West and we pray for Mothers' Union members in these two dioceses.

Nigeria is situated in Western Africa and is the seventh most populous country in the world. There are currently over 220 million inhabitants. The population has increased rapidly over the last five decades due to very high birth rates and child mortality dropping rapidly. Nigeria is a country one tenth the size of the United States.

In January of this year, in Gwagwalada diocese, the bishop, Rt Rev'd Moses Tabwaye, held 21 days of fasting, prayers and revival culminating in an anointing service in Holy Trinity cathedral, Gwagwalada. Mothers' Union played a significant part in this event.

LET US PRAY

Loving Lord, we thank you for the privilege of being linked with the dioceses of Gwagwalada and Ekiti West. Bless their members of Mothers' Union who are very active in creating opportunities for women and young girls to reach their full potential, working alongside the Women's Guild. We acknowledge the rift between Nigeria and the rest of the Anglican Communion and pray that Mothers' Union may be able to help towards reconciliation. Through Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen.

DIOCESE OF TEMOTU, in the Solomon Islands.

We pray for all members and their families in TEMOTU and all the SOLOMONS.

Although keeping in touch with such a remote area of the South Pacific is very difficult, we receive information bi-monthly from the Melanesian Mission Agency which provides support to the Anglican Church of Melanesia through, prayer, people and giving. The Anglican province of Melanesia covers the Solomon Islands, Vanuatu and New Caledonia.

Temotu is the Easternmost province of the Solomon Islands and it has the lowest population of all their provinces. It consists of two chains of islands which run parallel to each other from the North West to the South East. There is a tropical rainforest climate. As recently as this March cyclones Judy and Kevin struck the province, resulting in significant damage to breadfruit trees and other sources of livelihood, as well as damage to shelter and water sources. The outlying islands of Temotu are some of the worst affected by storm surges and sea level rise.

LET US PRAY

Loving Lord, we thank you for the privilege of being linked with the diocese of Temotu, and we pray for the Mothers' Union members there. We bring before you our concerns for the population of Temotu province as they face the effects of climate change. We pray for all those who are struggling with supplies of fresh, clean drinking water due to unpredictable weather patterns, saltwater inundation, flooding and coastal erosion. We pray for these communities, in their efforts to raise funds for water tanks and coastal defences.

LEICESTER in the Province of Canterbury, UK.

In our 'Re-imagining Mothers' Union' discussions, our trustees made two resolutions: to update our diocesan constitution to be more effective, and to raise the profile of Mothers' Union. As a result, we held the first, more informal, 'Member's Forum' (formerly known as Council) in March, and it was positively received.
